eadlines are here today gone tomorrow. No sooner did the news become affixed on the horrible events of the racism in Charlottesville, VA. Focused on the beatings, riots, and the running down and murder of a woman in the path of ground zero; that it had to drop that news story to follow up with a new more exciting story of the comments by President Trump. That too quickly took a back seat to the recent horrific multi-terrorism attacks in Spain.

a nuclear strike on Guam on the back burner. Even Iran's continuing to test its missiles, or China threatening the U.S. if we strike first to protect ourselves, had to be put on the back shelf. All of these stories quickly move to the back burners to make way for the next exciting news headline. Oh yes, what ever happened to the Russian story? I read the book, the butler did it.

Should any of the headlines filling the pages of the news, the internet, or the social media surprise any in the Church of God Community? Probably not, especially if you have been in the church for many years. From my earliest memories attending the church I can recall the warnings that the church taught from Scripture to cry aloud and spare not. These same warnings are as alive and required today as they were in 1971 when I came into the church or even 2,000 years ago.

While the specific day by day events are not foretold, the fruits of the spirit of man at the end time are clearly spelled out. We were told that there will be wars and rumors of war, famine, pestilence, lovers of self, brother against brother and on and on it goes. The news headlines today are simply reporting the fruits of man produced by living that evil way.

From the beginning of Jesus' ministry, these warnings were the central focus and the very core command given to the apostles and later passed along to the church. Notice what Matthew records immediately following His being

tempted by Satan: "From that time Jesus began to preach, and to say, Repent: for the kingdom of heaven is at hand." (Matt 4:17)

John the Baptist preached the same theme before Jesus' ministry began. John came to prepare the way for Jesus and preached the very same message. "In those days came John the Baptist, preaching in the wilderness of Judaea,

And saying, Repent ye: for the kingdom of heaven is at hand." (Matt. 3:1-2)

The apostles, after Jesus' crucifixion and His resurrection, obeyed those commands by continuing with those same warnings. "And Jesus came and spoke unto them, saying, All power is given unto me in heaven and in earth. Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit: All of those news stories put the news of Korea threatening Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world. Amen." (Matt 28: 18-20)

> Notice the apostle Paul's message to the Thessalonians: "For this we say unto you by the word of the Lord, that we which are alive and remain unto the coming of the Lord shall not prevent them which are asleep. For the Lord himself shall descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of the archangel, and with the trump of God: and the dead in Christ shall rise first: Then we which are alive and remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds, to meet the Lord in the air:" (I Thess. 4:15-17)

> I look back over the years to the time that I would hear the information I just shared with you, that they would preach over and over again. I would simply turn it off and tune it out. As soon as I would hear that theme that I would tell myself, here we go again, I've heard it all before, wondering when will they ever get off this kick? Ever felt that way? How about now, feel that way now?

We have a merciful God who understands our human nature. Jesus knew 2,000 years ago that the Kingdom of God wasn't going to take place then. Yet, He instructed His disciples to preach the warning message, giving them a sense of urgency as we should still have today. Since the time of the disciples, each generation has been given signs indicating

> that Christ's return could take place in their lifetime. We see this with Paul's message to the Thessalonians

> The warning message is but one of those ways that God uses to call new converts and keep the fire going. Human nature is funny, when everything is going well for people, they simply don't feel the need for God.

But through concern, alarm, tragedy, they reach out for God to intervene for them. But that is only the starting place. We must go on from there to a maturity level in our love of, and love for God. Through that growing process our mind and nature gradually changes.

At some point in our spiritual transformation, we no longer obey God's truth through concern or fear, but out of love and appreciation. Does the message of warning change at that point? Of course not, the message will not change. The only thing that changes is in how we receive it.

I must admit, I went though a period that I was tired of hearing the warnings, and the cry aloud and spare not sermons. Funny how human nature reacts. The very message that lit a fire in my heart reached the point that it was a mere amber, and I became bored with it. Have you ever felt that way, maybe you've been there too. Maybe now, God knows and understands those emotions, yet, at the same time He also tells us we are not to stay there. We are admonished to return to our first love. "Nevertheless I have somewhat against thee, because thou hast left thy first love." (Rev 2:4)

God's desire for us is to always be in our first love with Him. That our lives be continually filled with the excitement, joy, and zeal, of that first love, but He wants us to do so with the spiritual maturity of the mind of Christ.
