YESTERDAY IS HISTORY

I remember my mother telling me on New Year's Day, 1953, that she heard on the radio that Hank Williams had died. We did not have television at that time and I was only 14 years old. I remember little before this date. What I know today about the life and times of Hank Williams, the Great Depression, the "roaring twenties" as it was called, or the events surrounding World War 1, is only what I read in the history books. What will happen next week in world events or twenty years from now in the Church of God, Ministries International no one knows. After my 54 year association with the Churches of God, I now know that "Yesterday is history, tomorrow IS a mystery and I KNOW THAT ONLY THIS MOMENT (TODAY) IS

MINE." Today is all that anyone knows.

There is probably nothing I like more in life than the study of history. To understand the present we MUST

know what happened in the past. To appreciate the life and teachings of Her- strong remember about the times bert Armstrong we must understand the times in which he lived and wrote. To understand what it means to be poor and living in New York City today, we must know the past and how the poor once lived in New York City.

Example: Mr. Armstrong wrote the "Plain Truth" magazine under the caption "The Coming World Super-Government:"

"We have come into a condition where millions are in hunger and want---a fourth of the workers are out of jobs---in the midst of the greatest plenty the world ever had. Every financial structure in the world has collapsed."

Mr. Armstrong goes on to say that "The Bible has foretold every phase of these conditions, described in general in the above prophecy" (a reference in his article to Luke 21:24-26). Notice now what Mr. Armstrong says the outcome will be:

When ye see THESE THINGS come to pass KNOW ye that the Kingdom of God is at hand." (Luke 21:31) The emphasis is by Mr. Armstrong.

Example: How much do we know

about the times from when Mr. Armstrong was born in 1892 until he wrote his article in 1935?

In 1907, for example, when Herbert Armstrong was 15 years old, 90% of all doctors had no college education---2 out of 10 adults couldn't read or write---only 6% of all Americans had graduated from high school; life expectancy was 47 years because 30.4% of all deaths were by children under age 5 due to infectious diseases; today it is 1%. Do we remember what happened in 1907? Again, to appreciate the life of Herbert Armstrong and his role of leadership in the Worldwide Church of God, we must have a grasp of history; what was happening in America during his lifetime?

What did Herbert Armin which he lived? There was WWI; the influenza pandemic of 1918-1919 when he was 26 years old (30 to 50 million people died worldwide and 675,000 Americans died); the roaring 20s (see quote to follow), much like what we experienced in this country for following in the July 1935 edition of the the last 20+ years; the Great Depression and all the suffering that went along with it. In Herbert Armstrong's mind he saw the coming of the Kingdom of God because of events occurring in his own lifetime. The only knowledge most of us have of our nation's history in the early 20th century is what we read in the history books. We predict the future by what is happening today. Mr. Armstrong was no exception.

Quoting from an article entitled the "1920's Business and Economy:"

"Boom and Bust in the United States and World Economies:" The article goes on to say that "Fueled by easy money the nineteen-twenties were boom times like never before. The postwar (WWI) recession was forgotten as everyone went on a spending spree. Credit, and not saving's, enabled consumers to boost corporate profits to new levels." The automaker. "Henry Ford used his huge buying power to set-up discount grocery stores for his employees."

To appreciate what Mr. Armstrong has written and believed, we MUST understand the context of the times in which he lived.

What did it mean to be poor and living in New York City 200 years ago? Quoting from an article on page 26 in the New York Post on Friday, July 17, 2009 entitled "A Real Hard-Knock

Life;"

"By the 1800s, new immigrants were pouring into New York City by the millions. They were dirt poor and needed a place to live. The tenements were born."

"What was a tenement? It was a five-to-six story building with small. three room

apartments, housing 20 or more families.

"By the mid-1800s (the 1850s), more than half of New York City's population lived in tenements.

"It was a tough life. Imagine living in a tiny flat with no bathroom and no running water and little air with as many as 20 other people.

"A typical bedroom was 6 by 7 feet. The living room was the main room. It was 10 by 12 feet, and the only room with a window---if you were lucky. The hallway had no lighting and little air. Drinking and bathing water came from a nearby pond.

"To make matters worse, tenements were expensive---sometimes as much as \$20 a month when the average salary of a seamstress was \$5 a week.

"The overcrowding, lack of cleanliness and poor air supply caused health problems for tenement residents. Diarrhea and cholera were common. Children died at early ages from diseases that are no threat today."

My commitment as a Christian and to be about our Father's business is to devote myself to loving others, which includes sharing the gospel.

It's the little things in life that really count. It's the little things that people remember. Think about this: Sometime in the future, perhaps years from now when we no longer see our friend in church sitting to our right or left, our

Peace in the Middle East? Jerusalem is Sovereign Capital of Israel Netanyahu to UK:

Prime Minister Binyamin Netanyahu told British officials Tuesday in London that Israel would not stop building in any area of its capital city. Netanyahu was in the British capital to meet with UK Prime Minister Gordon Brown.

At the front entrance to Number 10 Downing Street, where the meeting took place, hundreds of protesters yelled epithets such as "Netanyahu's a war criminal." Others shouted "Free Palestine" and waved signs proclaiming "Jerusalem is the capital of Palestine," "Judea and Samaria are Palestinian territory" and "Let the Palestinians live."

Prime Minister Netanyahu, accompanied by Israeli Ambassador to London Ron Prosor, entered the building through the back entrance, where they were met by Prime Minister Brown. All three were flanked by security details.

Following the meeting, the two prime ministers held a joint news conference at which their differences were made clear. Despite Brown's insistence that the UK is a loyal friend to the Jewish State and supports the Israel-PA "peace process" the British prime minister underscored the UK demand that Israel halt construction in Judea, Samaria and parts of Jerusalem restored in 1967.

Prime Minister Netanyahu's response made it equally clear that he was having none of it.

"Jerusalem is not a settlement. It is the sovereign capital of the State of Israel, and Israel will not accept limits on its sovereignty there," he told reporters bluntly. "We have been building in Jerusalem for 3,000 years."

Moreover, growing Jewish families in the

existing communities of Judea and Samaria need schools for their children and homes to live in, he added. "This is different from grabbing land," he emphasized, and said he hoped to find a "bridging formula" that would enable Jews living in the regions to live a "normal life."

Israel has already removed more than 140 security checkpoints and roadblocks, Netanyahu pointed out, adding that it is now time for the Palestinian Authority to exhibit "courageous leadership" and recognize Israel as the Jewish homeland.

He also discussed his disappointment with the inflammatory rhetoric that came out of the recent Sixth Annual Fatah General Assembly held in Bethlehem, at which PA Chairman Mahmoud Abbas was elected to another five-year term as the faction's leader. Fatah, he said, should have adopted a straightforward stance that it is willing and

ready for an end to the conflict with Israel and all claims.

Noting that he had come forward and expressed his support for a PA state, Netanyahu said the PA leadership should reciprocate.



"We need a demilitarized Palestinian state that recognizes Israel," he said. "Recognition is the pillar of peace."

Fatah Convention: Incitement, No Peace

The convention, held earlier this month, appeared to be anything but a gathering of PA activists seeking peace, despite the generous financial support of the U.S. government, which gave Fatah \$50 million to cover conference expenses, according to a report in the Syrian daily Al-Watan that was translated by the Middle East Media Research Institute (MEMRI). The paper said that the financial support was an attempt to strengthening Palestinian Authority Chairman Mahmoud Abbas. However, said the paper, the U.S. rejected Abbas' request for permission to fire Palestinian Prime Minister Salam Fayyad.

Convicted murderer Marwan Barghouti was elected to the faction's Central Committee. Also elected, according to the preliminary results, were Jibril Rajoub and Mohammed Dahlan. Not making the list was former PA Prime Minister Ahmed Qureia, who had also served as head negotiator between the PA and Israel.

Delegates to the convention applauded loudly at the mention by Qureia of two terrorists who committed the worst terror attack in Israel's history.

In their final meetings, the delegates approved a resolution stating that Jerusalem is an "integral part of the Palestinian homeland and political entity." The holiest city in Judaism is "awaiting our sacrifices," stated the resolution, which Fatah committed itself to carry out "until Jerusalem returns to the Palestinians void of settlers and settlements."

Time Running Out on Iran

Netanyahu also told reporters that although

Iran is not yet capable of completing construction of a nuclear weapon, the window of opportunity within which to stop the Islamic Republic from doing so is growing smaller.

The prime minister said that, "Time is running out, it is late in the day, but it is not too late."

His British counterpart said, "If there is no further progress immediately [on talks to suspend Iran's nuclear development activitie, then I believe the world will have to look at stepping up sanctions against Iran as a matter of priority."



Peace in the Middle East? It's Crunch Time for Israel on Iran After years of failed diplomacy no one will be able to call an attack precipitous

Legions of senior American officials have descended on Jerusalem recently, but the most important of them has been Defense Secretary Robert Gates. His central objective was to dissuade Israel from carrying

out military strikes against Iran's nuclear weapons facilities. Under the guise of counseling "patience," Mr. Gates again conveyed President Barack Obama's emphatic thumbs down on military force.

The public outcome of Mr. Gates's visit appeared polite but inconclusive. Yet Iran's progress with nuclear weapons and air defenses means Israel's military option is declining over time. It will have to make a decision soon, and it will be no surprise if Israel strikes by year's end. Israel's choice could determine whether Iran obtains nuclear weapons in the foreseeable future.

Mr. Obama's approach to Tehran has been his "open hand," yet his gesture has not only been ignored by Iran but deemed irrelevant as the country looks inward to resolve the aftermath of its fraudulent election. The hardliner "winner" of that election, President Mah-

moud Ahmadinejad, was recently forced to fire a deputy who once said something vaguely soothing about Israel. Clearly, negotiations with the White House are not exactly topping the Iranian agenda.

Beyond that, Mr. Obama's negotiation strategy faces insuperable time pressure. French President Nicolas Sarkozy proclaimed that Iran must re-start negotiations with the West by September's G-20 summit. But this means little when, with each passing day, Iran's nuclear and ballistic missile laboratories, production facilities and military bases are all churning. Israel is focused on these facts, not the illusion of "tough" diplomacy. Israel rejects another feature of Mr. Obama's diplomatic stance. Under the worst-case scenario, Iran will continue improving its nuclear facilities and Mr. Obama will become the first U.S. president to tie the issue of Israel's nuclear capabilities into negotiations about Iran's.

Israel understands that Secretary of State Hillary Clinton's recent commitment to extend the U.S. "defense umbrella" to Israel is not a guarantee of nuclear retaliation, and that it is wholly insufficient to deter Iran from obliterating Israel if it so decides. In fact, Mrs. Clinton's comment tacitly concedes that Iran will acquire nuclear weapons, exactly the wrong message. Since Israel, like the U.S., is well aware its missile defense system is imperfect, whatever Mr. Gates said about the "defense umbrella" will be politely ignored.

Relations between the U.S. and Israel are more strained now than at any time since the 1956 Suez Canal crisis. Mr. Gates's message for Israel not to act on Iran, and the U.S. pressure he brought to bear, highlight the weight of Israel's lonely burden.

Striking Iran's nuclear program will not be precipitous or poorly thought out. Is-

rael's attack, if it happens, will have followed enormously difficult deliberation over terrible imponderables, and years of patiently waiting on innumerable failed diplomatic efforts. Absent Israeli action, prepare for a nuclear Iran.

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tinians, and finally reestablished Jerusalem as their capitol. From that time until now, Israel has vowed they will never release its control again.

In the context of President Obama's speech, one news commentator asked, "Did we just witness the selling out of Israel?" The portion of the speech he

was referring to was the following: "We continue to call on Palestinians to end incitement against Israel, and we continue to emphasize that America does not accept the legitimacy of continued Israeli settlements. The time has come to re-launch nego-

tiations without preconditions that addresses the permanent-

status issues: security for Israelis and Palestinians; borders, refugees and Jerusalem. The goal is clear: two states living side by side in peace and security - a Jewish State of Israel, with true security for all Israelis; and a viable, independent Palestinian state with contiguous territory that ends the occupation that began in 1967, and realizes the potential of the Palestinian people."

President Obama was referring to the land that Israel now occupies that they say they will never give up. He stated that the U.S. no longer recognizes the settlements that occurred following the six day war. This also includes the reestablishment of the control of Jerusalem. These statements may have gone unnoticed by the rest of the world, but rest assured, it did not go unnoticed by Israel.

Following that speech, insult was added to injury when the UN allowed President Mahmoud Ahmadinejad to address the body. The U.S. representative, as well as some of the representatives of other foreign countries left the hall during the speech. However, there were many who chose to remain and give him recognition.

The following day, President Netanyahu gave a very eloquent, but scathing speech to those who remained in the hall for the address by Ahmadinejad. This speech also did not go unnoticed by the rest of the world, in particular, the Arab world.

Report Says Iran is Capable of Building a Nuke, All it Needs is a Delivery System

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at the International Atomic Energy

Agency (IAEA) prepared a secret document on Iranian nuclear capabilities. According to the report, Iran already has "sufficient information"

to prepare an atom bomb, the report reveals, but the Islamic Republic is missing a sufficient delivery system. However, the AP says, quoting the secret report, Iran is expected to overcome that limitation.

The United States has claimed that outgoing IAEA Chairman Mo-

hamed ElBaradei had prepared just such a "secret annex". More generally, Israel and the U.S. recently charged that the IAEA was not revealing all it knew about Iranian nuclear weapons development.

On the other hand, as early as 2005, ElBaradei said that it would take Iran only a few months to produce an atomic bomb if production went ahead at the nuclear plants the IAEA was not given access to at the time.

Earlier this month, Glyn Davies, the U.S. envoy to the IAEA, confirmed long-time Israeli intelligence reports that Iran is close to achieving the ability to produce a nuclear bomb. He said that Iran was "very near or already in possession of sufficient low-enriched uranium to produce one nuclear weapon."

Talks With Iran

Regardless of these assessments, six major world powers - the U.S., Britain, France, Germany, China and Russia began holding discussions in early Oct. about their Nuclear capabilities.

Iranian Foreign Minister Manouchehr Mottaki insisted that his country would not hold direct talks with the Americans at the meetings. "The Americans will directly be present at the negotiating table and during this round of negotiations, different subjects and issues will be discussed and studied," Mottaki said, according to Iran's news agency.

Russia, meanwhile, expressed clear opposition to additional sanctions on Iran in order to coerce its compliance with nuclear development restrictions sought by the international community. Russian Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov said in late September, "Today there is a real chance to con-

clude talks whose results should be an agreement restor-

agreement restoring trust in the purely peaceful nature of Iran's nuclear program. Disrupting this chance by demanding swift imposition of sanctions would be a serious mistake."

Iran denies any of its nuclear programs are for the development of weapons, con-

trary to American, Israeli and European assessments.

Regarding the use of force against Iran should the Islamic Republic persist in nuclear development, Lavrov said it "would have catastrophic effect for the entire Middle East."

Obama Drops E. Europe's Defensive "Umbrella"

Apparently as part of negotiations with Russia over cooperation on the Iran issue, among others, President Barack Obama announced recently that he has dropped Bush administration-era plans for a missile defense umbrella in Eastern Europe. According to the plan, American interceptor missiles and radar systems were to be deployed in Poland and the Czech Republic, respectively.

The Bush administration had promoted the "umbrella" plans as defense against long-range missile attack, possibly loaded with weapons of mass destruction, by nations such as Iran and North Korea. Russia, however, saw the planned deployment as a challenge to its own security in the region.

Israel, meanwhile, remains committed to its position on Iran regardless of any international political machinations. In an interview with Israel's Channel 2 TV, Prime Minister Binyamin Netanyahu repeated his familiar formula that Iran must not be allowed to get its hands on nuclear weapons. He provided no further details regarding Israel's plans to prevent that eventuality.

Iran's President Mahmoud Ahmadinejad said that while Iran would never stop its nuclear program it won't produce nuclear weapons at least for the meantime. In an interview with *NBC-TV* from his presidential compound on Thursday, Ahmadinejad said, "We don't need nuclear weapons. We don't see any need for such weapons." He added, "And the conditions around the world are moving to favor our ideas." Ahmadinejad said that Tehran won't take any steps that might weaken its defenses against "the Zionists" and "the warheads which have been stockpiled in Britain, in the U.S., in a handful of other countries." NBC's Ann Curry asked Iran's president three times if there would be any scenarios in which Teheran would move to create a nuclear weapon.




At first, Ahmadinejad used his standard response that nuclear weapons are no longer useful. "If nuclear weapons were influential, they would have prevented the downfall of the Soviet Union — for that matter, the downfall of the Zionist regime. Our people have never had a need for nuclear weapons." "So, may I assume, then, your answer to that

question is 'no'?" Curry asked. The Iranian president replied, "We don't need such — we don't have a such a need, nuclear weapons. We don't need nuclear weapons. Without such weapons, we are very much able

to defend ourselves." Iran has repeatedly stated that its uranium enrichment program would be used for only peaceful means – something that Israel and western countries doubt. Ahmadinejad's statements of threatening to "wipe Israel off the map" aren't understood by Israel as mere rhetoric.

A "secret annex" to a report by the international nuclear energy watchdog says Iran is currently able to build a nuclear bomb, according to the *Associated Press*. Meanwhile, Russia and America spar over a meeting with Iran to negotiate the issue.

Ladybird Beetles and praying mantis) should be killed since they prey on insects which harm our plants. A Disaster waiting to happen !

The recent outbreak of fires in California have everyone focused on the fire, but there is a greater risk on the rise that goes beyond the fires, and that is the farmers. They are suffering through an environmental crisis and the government is there to make it so much

worse. Central Valley, a 400mile long area spanning 18 counties in California is responsible for 57 percent of



the state's total farming. But more importantly for our nation, California represents about 13 percent of the farm receipts in the entire country. That's going to make almonds, artichokes, olives, nectarines, grapes, strawberries, peaches, plums and lettuce everything else a lot harder to get. Why?

Common sense will tell you the damaging effects of keeping water from a drought-stricken area. Farmers stand to lose \$1.2 billion in revenue this year -- this according to the study by the University of California. That means less food and higher cost to everyone in America. The irony is that the government is actually starving the farmers to save a fish.

On Dec. 15, 2008, the Bush administration's Fish and Wildlife Service chose fish, a decision driven by a lawsuit filed in federal court in 2006 by the Natural Resources Defense Council and other environ-

> mental groups. To settle the suit, the Fish and Wildlife Service agreed to divert more than

150 billion gallons of water this year away from farmers south of San Francisco in hopes of protecting the Delta smelt—a three-inch bait fish. The water is now flowing underneath the Golden Gate Bridge and out into the Pacific Ocean.

This decision has caused the loss of nearly 35,000 jobs, and millions of dollars in food relief help for families to survive the crisis. This is in addition to the crises that the economic slump has caused the state of California. The governor has already had to go to Washington to get help from their already bankrupt budget.

By June 30th, 2009 the Fresno Community Food Bank distributed about 14.5 million pounds of food. That was a record to the residents in three counties, twice as much as they gave out last year. Governor Schwarzenegger even called for a state of emergency in half of the Central Valley's counties, as well as asking President Obama to declare Fresno a disaster area to help pay for food shipments to the area known as California's agricultural heart. The Wall street Journal reported Aug 15, 2009

In 1931, a severe drought began that within a few years engulfed the Oklahoma panhandle and a third of the Great Plains in a "Dust Bowl." Tens of thousands of people fled the region—many traveling to California along Route 66, which John Steinbeck called "the mother road, the road of flight" in "The Grapes of Wrath."

A lot of the "Okies" settled in the San Joaquin Valley. In the decades that followed, state and federal officials built dams and other irrigation projects that helped turn the valley into some of the world's richest farmland.


But today the San Joaquin Valley is being transformed into a dust bowl. Hundreds of thousands of acres are fallow, while almond and plum trees are being left to die in the scorching sun. Tens of thousands of people have been tossed out of work—the town of Mendota alone has an unemployment rate of about 40%—and the lines for food donations stretch down streets. The reason? There isn't enough water to go around this year, and the Obama administration is drawing up new reasons to divert more of it from farms and people and into the San Francisco Bay.

The valley has traditionally been a place where someone with few belongings, little education and even no ability to speak English could prosper by picking grapes, milking cows, or hoeing cotton fields. The hearty people who came here were Portuguese, Mexican, Armenian, Italian, Basque and Dutch, along with westward-traveling Americans and Okies. More recent arrivals are from El Salvador, Vietnam and India. I am the product of a Portuguese family that came decades ago. California has the largest water storage and transportation system in the world. With 1,200 miles of canals and nearly 50 reservoirs, the system captures enough water to irrigate about four million acres and provide water to 23 million people. In many cases, as with the San Joaquin Valley, water in this system is sold to communities by the federal government.

Some claim that California is facing a three-yearold drought. But, according to the state's Department of Water Resources, California reservoirs have received 80% of their normal amount of water and precipitation in the northern Sierras has been 95% of its yearly average this year. So why isn't there more water for farms? Because theirs is a regulatorymandated drought. The 1973 Endangered Species Act requires that the government take steps to save endangered species. In California, that's meant diverting vast sums of water into rivers and streams to protect fish. Those diversions this year have forced federal authorities to decide who to serve—fish or farmers.

Schwarzenegger's office was forced to set aside \$4 million, enough to buy enough food to hold them for approximately one week.

Congress has the power to solve this crisis. In 2003, a fish-versus-families debate erupted in New Mexico after water deliveries to Albuquerque from the Rio Grande River were cut off to protect habitat for the silvery minnow—another threeinch bait fish. Congress temporarily suspended portions of the Endangered Species Act and guaranteed that water would be provided to Albuquerque. The situation in California is virtually identical and repeating what was done in

New Mexico would do wonders for San Joaquin Valley farmers.

The problem: Conflicting opinions by two differing government agencies. Quoting from a letter by Governor Schwarzenegger, Sept 1, 2009: The recent biological opinions issued by the U.S. (USFWS) and the National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS)to protect threatened fish species in the Delta include overlapping and conflicting actions and restrictions that provide little or no fisheries benefit but do come at a high cost to the economy. The opinions cover both the state and federal water projects but were developed separately, by separate agencies. Ironically, these opinions work against each other, especially in wet years, which may lead to species conflict and devastating water shortages in following dry years.

The letter went on to describe the monumental crises these problems are causing: "Water deliveries by the State Water Project and federal Central Valley Project to the two-thirds of California's population south of the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta are just 40 percent and 10 percent of normal, respectively. Sixty-four water agencies throughout the state have implemented mandatory rationing to respond to shortages and, on the agricultural front alone, we estimate that these reduced deliveries will result in a Central Valley farm revenue loss of as much as \$710 million and cost 35,000 jobs."

Note: California has been waiting on response to this problem for over three years. Surely if there was any soundness in those running the government, a solution would have been found. In conclusion the question boils down to just one important

issue, do we save the little fish, or families and human lives?

At the end of Governor Schwarzenegger's letter he concluded, "*Thirty-eight million Californians stand waiting for your formal response*." I'll add, the rest of the world is also waiting the response, because the next environmental response might by in your home town.

(IsraelNN.com) A Jerusalem walkway from the times of the Patriarch Abraham, protected by a wall of large rocks, has been discovered, and will be displayed to the public on Thursday.

The double-wall was uncovered in a dig run by the Israel Antiquities Authority (IAA) and sponsored by the City of David Association. Prof. Roni Reich of the University of Haifa, who is directing the dig together with Eli Shukrun of the IAA, told Israel National News, "Based on clay pottery fragments found at the site, it is assumed to have been built by the Canaanites some 3,700 years ago, during the period known as the Middle Bronze Age."

The Patriarch Abraham met with "Malki-Tzedek, King of Shalem" - later known as Jerusalem - during this period, according to Biblical chronology and Genesis 14,18.

The fortifications are eight meters (over 26 feet) high, and served to protect those walking down to a spring in what is now the National Park, around and at the foot of the walls of Jerusalem. Some 24 meters of the double wall's length have been uncovered, but it is apparently even longer, waiting to be uncovered in the future.

"This is the most massive wall ever discovered in the City of David," Reich said. "It is tremendously large in terms of its dimensions, thickness, and size of the rocks used. It appears that they protect a walk-way used to walk down from some tower atop the hill towards the spring."

The protected passage is designed to solve an inherent paradox in the need for a spring, Reich explained: "On the one hand, water is necessary, especially in times of crisis, but its source is located in a spring, in the lowest and most vulnerable spot in the area. Thus the need to build such a protected passage, even



though it involved great effort." A small part of the fortifications was first discovered exactly 100 years ago by a British archaeologist, but now it has become clear that these were just part of a very large double-wall. "This is the first time we have found such massive building in Jerusalem from before the period of King Herod," Reich said.

Fortifications on such a massive scale indicate that Jerusalem became, at this

time, a city-state of its own that was able to deploy and gather the resources to build them. "A small village would not have been able to build such a structure," Reich said. "This discovery shows that our picture of Jerusalem's eastern fortifications, and of its water supply, from these periods is far from complete," Reich said. "Though so many people have dug this hill, there is still a strong chance that large architectural elements are still well-hidden and waiting to be discovered." The fortifications will be opened to the public for the first time on Thursday during the 10th annual City of David Research Conference. Other discoveries will be on display as well, and tours of the area -17 different routes! -

will be provided as well.
